There has been a lovely working atmosphere again this week in school with our Design and Technology and English Learning Experience really gaining momentum. I cannot wait to see the final outcomes from each class as the children are really engaged with their learning and the work they are producing is excellent. I had a super visit from year 3/4 children who had really thought carefully about the questions they needed to ask me to create a bespoke muffin that met my requirements. They were not only aware of the content of their questionnaire but also how to ask questions using oracy skills such as eye contact, body language and tone of voice. I have to say I am in no doubt that the muffin they create for me will meet my requirements! Year 5/6 set all our taste buds tingling on Wednesday when they taste tested their pizza designs and analysed them to select their final designs. They have been busy understanding about how a popular food choice such as a pizza can be a healthy choice and how it can be adapted for different dietary requirements. I look forward to hearing their persuasive pitches for their final design choices.
