As we come to the end of a busy half term, we would like to thank you all for your continued support working in partnership with us. Assessments

Part of quality first teaching is assessing children's learning and as a school we are continually assessing through observations, marking, discussions and using more formative assessments. In the past couple of weeks (as has been the case most half terms) we have been carrying out assessments in reading, writing and maths and in the case of Year 2 and Year 6 we have been using old SAT materials to do these. In assessing we do not intend to put children under any pressure, and we always explain to them that all we want them to do is their best so we can work out how best to develop them moving forwards. I will, in future, inform you of assessment dates so that you too can reassure your children if they have concerns.

Somerscience festival

Haynes Motor Museum and Castle Cary venues, Somerset

The Somerscience Festival is back in 2024! Somerset's only rural STEM festival will be even bigger and better and hopes to exceed the nearly 5000 visitors who enjoyed it last year. This time there will be over 90 different activities from nearly 70 organisations all bringing Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths breakthroughs to South Somerset families in a fun and engaging way. And it is FREE with no need to

book, with Haynes Motor Museum, Market House, Caryford Hall and Ansford Academy in Castle Cary as main venues.

Visitors can find out about airline safety mechanisms or how the famous Henry vacuum cleaner is put together. Or investigate how we map the oceans or what lives in the deep. Exhibitors include all the universities of the area, Nikon, Honeywell, Thales UK, Leonardo, National Grid, RSPCA and many other well known names. There are space planetarium shows, chemistry magic shows, and psychology or robotics workshops, and the biozone is back with its Teddy Bear Hospital, Dr Snot and also with activities including immunology, foot health, stem cell research and how fish help us find out more about disease. Tata CS will be there to award the prizes to the students who have succeeded in the Somerscience Festival Challenge to build a digital innovation to support more sustainable transport across the county and there are schools exhibiting how their students tackle STEM in classroom. Plus a whole programme of talks and a key debate with a panel of leading industrialists chaired by Sarah Dyke MP on whether Somerset can become the green technology hub of the UK.

Throughout the day visitors can travel between Haynes and Castle Cary on the free festival shuttle buses which will be operating continuously.

The organisation behind the festival is The Somerscience Trust, which was set up especially to make this festival happen, and this has been funded through main grants and sponsorships from Thales UK, Royal Commission for the 1851 Exhibition, Somerset Community Foundation, ICMS, Royal Society of Biology and Stronger Starts.
